



MS IN CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

The Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling is designed for students planning careers as clinical mental health counselors. This full-time, hybrid program consists of 60 credits and offers an emphasis on couples and family counseling, allowing for dual licensure. The specialized curriculum provides students with opportunities to explore the developmental, social, and cultural foundations of behavior across the life span, including an 800-hour clinical internship. Our program is designed to provide comprehensive training for individuals who wish to counsel diverse populations in a variety of mental health settings.

The CMHC program offers two sites, with cohorts based in Palm Coast and Jacksonville.

- Resume / Curriculum Vitae
- 3 Letters of Recommendation
- A GRE/GMAT score is required of students with a 3.0 GPA or below
